As we just had a Board meeting and considering that there will not be another Branches until the end of November, it would be good to update you on a few matters.

Our principal has been keeping close tabs on the kindergarten class with respect to the concerns expressed. At our Board meeting he reported that he has no concerns about the progress of the kindergarten class and the teacher's ability to carry on. The instruction and classroom events are moving along quite well.

On a different note, because of additional learning assistance requirements and the make up of the class, the Principal and EdCom recommended the hiring of a .6 FTE teacher's assistant for grade one. Finances were also a matter of urgent attention at our meeting. The receivables grew substantially in the last month. We urge everyone to continually keep current with their tuition or membership fees. Please keep the already busy positions of treasurer and bookkeeper at a manageable level.

The Board also had to deal with nominations for Board members. Elsewhere in this issue of Branches you will find the nominations. As nominations for Board members were needed, that must mean that some are leaving. Two members have completed their term; Walter Nordeman and Verne Stel and two have resigned including Bob Onderwater. For all of you it was something new, your first term as CCES Board member. You came with no idea of what was involved as a member of the Board. However, using your talents and gifts, you put your hearts into carrying out your tasks and learned and accomplished a lot in the process. Principal's Report

The Christian Teachers Association (CTA) Convention

As I write this, we have just returned from the CTA Convention in Abbotsford (Oct. 9&10). As I mentioned in our last issue, this year's theme was taken from Micah 6:8: "What does the Lord require of you?" We were challenged by speakers and workshop presenters to live out our calling as teachers in response to what the Lord requires of us.

The key-note speaker, Dr. Doug Blomberg (Australia), explored the implications for the practice of focusing on the formation of this kind of character. As Blomberg sees it, there are two "spiritualities" at work in Western culture: the Greek obsession with ideal, unchanging knowledge, and, the biblical tradition of social, dialogical closeness, experienced in particular historical contexts. On the one side, theory stands as guide; on the other, wisdom. For the former, the discipline of knowledge and disciplined mastery of skills are key; for the latter, disciplining ourselves to the Lord is paramount. Reviewing the various rationales for moral development and education, Blomberg suggested that wisdom is the biblically appropriate goal for schooling. While helping students to develop knowledgeable and skilful competence is an important task, this task must always be for the sake of realizing the values that are at the heart of our image-bearing: obedience

to God, fidelity to neighbours, and justice to all creatures.

Micah's injunction to act justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with our God challenges us in today's society to structure our schools as a just community, promoting the well-being of all students, not mainly those labelled "talented". A school structured for promotion of such a community beyond the school walls will expose them to complex, real-world problems that overflow the boundaries of conventional subject areas and require an active response, drawing on the gifts of all. If curriculum is the selection and organization of experience for educational purposes, a curriculum oriented to motivating students towards just and faithful action in obedience to God will select such experiences in the light of this criterion. If students are to develop the qualities that Micah calls them to, schools have a responsibility to introduce them to the suffering of others, whether face-to-face or vicariously, and to help them discern the forces of evil. And students must not only be informed; they must be challenged and equipped to take action.

Early Learning

The BC Ministry of Education (MOE) is proposing full-time Kindergarten and half-time pre-school. The jury is still out on that, but it is widely being accepted as a fait accompli. However, this does not necessarily mean that such a proposal would

make it mandatory. The Board will be putting some thought into this. As of now, it would be premature to draw conclusions. The FISA has addressed this issue and communicated its thoughts on this matter to its member schools. It has provided us with terms of reference that can be a springboard for discussion and eventual decision-making.

Also this year we have received a grant from the MOE of \$1250 for the Ready, Set, Learn program. This program is designed to help three-year olds get ready for school. We will be planning to have a session similar as in past years, probably in April. Stay tuned.

School Activities

The CCES students are scheduled to attend the operatic performance of "The Barber of Bakersville" on Monday, Nov. 3, presented by the Vancouver Opera. This performance is scheduled to take place in the Langley Canadian

Reformed Church building. The performance is scheduled to run from 10:30 – 11:30 a.m. The William of Orange Christian School students will be joining us for this event. The Vancouver Opera is on this tour to promote the celebration of British Columbia's 150th anniversary. Rather than having students visiting the Vancouver Orpheum, which can be a daunting and intimidating experience for students and organizers, the Vancouver Opera group is visiting various localities to make this opera more accessible.

Now that we have changed our school starting time to 8:40 a.m., it should be noted that our Monday morning assemblies also start earlier: 8:45 a.m. This was apparently not clear to some parents who arrived late for our Thanksgiving assembly. We regret the inconvenience this caused.. Our next Special Day Assembly (Reformation Day) is scheduled for Monday, Oct. 27.



Minutes of the CCES AGM

May 28, 2008



1. Opening and Welcome: The Chairman P.J. Schouten opened the meeting and requested all to join in singing Psalm 76. He read from Psalm 111. Everyone was welcomed to the meeting. A quorum was met after making some phone calls to members.
2. Minutes of the October 24, 2007 AGM: A Motion "to approve the Minutes of the October 24, 2007 meeting as presented" was made, seconded and carried by the membership.
3. Business arising from the minutes: None.
4. CCES Budget 2008/09: The Treasurer V. Stel presented the 2008/09 budget to the membership. Question: Why is there an increase in transfer payments to CCHS. Reply: This is due to the decreasing enrollment of the other feeder schools of CCHS and our enrollment increasing. Question: Should the government grant for Special Education increase due to the increased need in our school? Reply: There are two students that we have not received funding for yet because they do not currently reside in Canada. Once they arrive and come to our school, more grants will be looked into. Motion: "to approve the CCES budget for 2008/09" was made, seconded and carried by the membership.
5. Credo Aid Presentation: Sr. H. Vandergugten highlighted the work that Credo Aid carries out on a yearly basis. Currently Credo Aid has a surplus and would like to use this money to purchase a new playground. They have asked the Development Committee to help pay for this with the money they raise at their annual Golf Tournament. A new playground would cost approximately \$30,000. The hope is that a committee could be organized to carry out the purchase and installation of this playground. Question: Has Credo Aid checked with different suppliers? Reply: Yes they have, and their quotes were similar. Question: What is the lifespan of these playgrounds. Reply: Approximately 20-30 years. Question: Have we checked into whether our insurance premiums would be affected once this playground would be installed? Reply: Currently when the insurance adjusters do their yearly walk around, our current playground is a big concern, so a new playground will be welcome.
6. Question Period: Concerns were raised about the kindergarten teacher situation. The current teacher/ student ratio for kindergarten is higher than what the school policy states. In the past we have hired a second kindergarten teacher. Why aren't we doing it this time? Reply: The Board has made a decision to provide a .25FTE T.A. (Teacher's Assistant) for the kindergarten class. After two months this will be evaluated and a decision will be made at that time as to whether or not a second teacher is required.
7. Closing: The membership sang from Psalm 65: 1,2. Brother Sixten Koat closed in prayer.
8. The chairman adjourned the meeting.


