Principal's Report

Well, it's been a while since we last reported via this medium (Feb 28, 2010). The last time we mentioned several activities on the go: Report Cards, Parent-Student Conferences; Foundation Skills Assessment (FSAs); Change for Change Drive; and, the Easter Concert. On the last item, the Easter Concert, I would still like to (once again) thank Mrs. Deglint for the hard and wonderful work she did with the students. Thank you, students, for your enthusiastic performance! The Change for Change Drive (Bethesda) was able to garner approximately \$1,200. A hearty thank-you to all who contributed so generously.

And so, we move onward, quickly approaching the end of the school year. By the time you read this, I hope to be back from my conference attendance in the Netherlands (barring volcanic eruptions, or other disasters). This 3rd International Conference of Reformed Education was held from April 26-28. The last time, the conference was held in Sumas, WA; this time, in Lunteren, the Netherlands. The theme is Faith and Learning, a follow-up to the Sumas location conference. Key-notes, speeches, and workshops are to deal with the integration of learning and faith and the implementation of such in the classroom. We hope to share our insights with Reformed Christian educators from Canada, Australia, and the Netherlands.

The Gr. 5 DARE graduation was held Monday, April 19. The graduation was conducted by Officer Neil Jensen, supervisor of the Fraser Valley West Detachment of Fisheries and Oceans Canada and the DARE instructor. Also in attendance were: Corporal Beth Couture of the RCMP; Detachment Supervisor Nicole Galant; Area Chief of Fisheries Herb Redekopp. Parents of the grade 5 students were also present as were the Grade 4 students. Officer Jensen briefly explained the purpose of the Drug Abuse Resistance Education course and the

activities the students were required to do during the one hour per week (for 10 weeks). Several of the grade 5 students read their DARE report to the audience, telling all there what a privilege it was to learn more about the terrible consequences of the abuse of drugs. Ms Couture ten addressed all present of the wonderful work Officer Jensen continues to offer through this program, for which he was rewarded with a plaque from the RCMP.

Also on Monday April 19 we were able to have a presentation from the Feunekes family on their work in Indonesia. They shared with us via power-point /video clips what it is a family experiences as they move from home to foreign and strange lands, with different languages and customs.

The annual Quad-Schools Public Speaking Contest was held last Friday (April 30). Grade 6 & 7 students spent the last few weeks or so writing up speeches and practising delivery of these speeches. Through two sessions of public speaking in our own gym, the CCES finalists for the Friday event were selected. At this time of writing, of course, we do not know the results, but hope to have heard about it by today. At this time, allow me to thank our local judges for offering their time to help us in determining the finalists.

The Kindergarten Day is scheduled for May 5, 2010. Parents of those children who are registered to attend Kindergarten as of Sept., 2010 are invited bring their children to school that day. Mrs. J. Onderwater and Ms Leslie Scholtens will receive your children at 8:40 a.m. and ask that you pick them up again at 11:30 a.m. Those same parents should have received a K-package from the school with information pertinent to this K-Day; if not, please call the office.

Grade 8 Day is another indicator that the school year ending is near. On that day, Friday, May 21, all the current grade 7 students who are enrolled in the CCHS next September are expected to be at the high school. They will come to the high school by means of the same transportation as they regularly use and go home as they regularly do.

If you are ever in the area, do stop by to view our "United Nations" wall-map. You'll notice that the parents and children of CCES represent 17 different countries! We haven't selected a Security Council yet; we think the Board is doing an excellent job.

The Library Challenge: Sometimes, parents ask us if they could donate a book or two to our school library. CCES encourages anyone to donate library books. We're calling it the "Library Challenge". That is, if you have a book that you think might be of interest to the school then please feel welcome to buy it for the school. Opening: The Chairman, Br. Mike Stam, opened the meeting through reading from Deuteronomy 6 and leading in prayer. All directors were present and welcomed to the meeting.

Approval of Minutes and Short Report: The Board approved the minutes from a series of ad-hoc meetings held specifically to deal with the leave of absence of Br. Mike Van. The Board also approved the minutes of the regular Board meetings held December 08 2009 and January 12 2010. The short report for the Board meeting held January 12 2010 was approved for publication.

Matters from the Minutes: The Board discussed an inconsistency regarding school initiation fees between the CCES Constitution and preferred Board policy established a few years ago. A proposal will be made to the membership at the Spring Annual General Meeting.

Incoming Correspondence: A note of thanks, and a letter from Br. H. Snijder formally accepting appointment as Principal were received.

Outgoing Correspondence: Thank you letters were sent to Br. Troy VanBostelen and Sr. Linda VanSpronsen for participation in the Principal Search Committee. A letter was also sent to the other candidate for Principal. Congratulations were sent to Sr. Allison

Principal's report: Br. John Roukema discussed highlights of the Principals report including updating the conflict management policy, Board-staff visitation, special education FTE requirements and candidates for the Grade 4 teaching position.

Education Committee: Sr. Janet Schouten discussed highlights of the Education Committee activities including a Library Enhancement Promotion and a Bullying Workshop evening tentatively set for Monday March 29 2010.

Special Education Committee: The Special Education Committee will submit a proposed budget along with the draft full school budget at the April Board meeting.

Finance Committee: A new, non-voting, membership category is being explored.

Development Committee: The annual bowling evening was well attended and broke even financially. The Committee will proceed with planning a golf tournament for around Father's day this year.

Credo Christian High School: Sr. Valerie Sikkema reported in developments at Credo Christian High School including the search for a LA and replacement for Br. H. Snijder.

Maintenance Committee: Br. Dan MacKay is expected to retire in Spring 2010. Br. Mike

IT Committee: The Committee will evaluate the merits of replacing the existing computer lab with a mobile computer lab.


