Principal's Report

It did not take long for all of us to get settled in; we are in full swing. The students have been eager to assume their regular school duties. The weather, too, has been very good during these first days. Students used every opportunity to make good use of the playground facilities. Also the buses have been running smoothly and on time. We congratulate Mr. Rick Ostermeier on his appointment as the new CCSTA (Combined Christian Schools Transportation Association) bus manager and we hope that all things will go well with his assignment.

During the last week of September I joined my Canadian Reformed and URC colleagues from across this vast land at the National Principals Conference (Sept. 28-30), at the Crieff Retreat Centre, which is situated in the Cambridge, ON vicinity. This conference was planned and organized by the Ontario Principals Association. The theme for this conference was: "Learning for Serving" (Matthew 5:13-16). Key-note speakers focused on discernment and apologetics, picking up from where we left off at our last NPC (Sumas, WA). Workshops speakers or presenters attempted to show ways to implement ideas having to do with apologetics.

The CCES staff attended the CTABC Convention in Abbotsford, BC on Thursday, Oct. 8 and Friday, Oct. 9. The two-day get-together featured several keynote speakers and many workshops. The theme for this year's convention was:

Be United; Be Renewed; Be Encouraged; Be Transformed...

For all time the God of all ages has embodied justice, grace, love, compassion, mercy, peace... the list goes on. In a world that is often set against these qualities, we are called to join Him as He seeks to redeem what has been lost to the grip of sin, transforming not only ourselves, but also His creation. As teachers, we have been blessed with the call to take part in this task personally, and to equip future generations with the knowledge and ability to come along side us. The 2009 CTABC/NWCSI Teachers convention will address the challenge of fostering the qualities needed to be a redeeming influence within His creation. In so doing, we seek to see not only minds, but also hearts and hands united, renewed, encouraged and transformed... that we might fully learn to know God's will, His good and pleasing and perfect will. Romans 12:1-2

This all sounds like a tall order, and so it is. It is a bit like our Mission Statement, which

states well, you can read it in the school's front entrance hallway, or, better yet, on the front cover of this issue. As it is explained in the CCES Curriculum Binder, this Mission Statement presents a description of the "responsible steward" as one who is

- 1) a relational being, and
- 2) a reflective being.

As a relational being: we serve our covenant God by obeying his word as the authoritative norm of life; seek the good of our neighbor and of all of creation, and; seek what is good for ourselves through the proper care of the gifts God has given us. As a reflective being: we are aware that all of creation is under the curse of sin and that all of creation is under the redeeming Lordship of Jesus Christ. As reflective beings we commit ourselves to use our God-given talents to develop knowledge, skills, and attitudes in all areas of life; to learn, think critically, test the spirits of this age, and to communicate information from, a broad knowledge base.

And so, with these concepts in mind, in line with Romans 12:1 & 2, the Reformed Christian School finds itself in a situation in which it must actively promote the vision and practices of Christian education in a broad educational environment that derives its vision and practices from self-centred worldviews. A capitulation to the latter would blur our distinctiveness as people covenanting with God Yahweh.

As Reformed people in North America we have long been preoccupied with our identity and heritage; the two are distinct from that of mainstream North American Christians and they are very dear to us. We come from a background where much emphasis is placed on the education our children receive. We see our schools as places where our children are to be nurtured and instructed as they would be in their homes. In our activities in God's Kingdom we work from the context of the relationship which God has initiated with us. We look at efforts in terms of service, discipleship, and stewardship. Our children need to learn from

an early age on that they do not live for themselves but for the service of the Master, and that what they have is not their own but their Master's. We emphasize the covenant relationship the child has with God. We stress that God's children have to be doers of the Word, not hearers only. We model and instruct the children that they have to be disciples of Christ who listen to his Word and follow after him, that they have to be stewards of God's Kingdom who show conscientious care for all that God has made and given.

Let us then encourage each other, be renewed and transformed by His Spirit, so that in unity of purpose we can be blessed with the call to take the task to equip future generations with the knowledge, skills, and attitudes for a life of responsible and responsive stewardship.

Approval of Minutes and Short Report: Motion: "to approve the minutes of the May 12, 2009 meeting as presented" was made. Minutes and Short Report were approved. The Minutes of the May 29, 2009 membership meeting were reviewed and accepted for presentation at the next membership meeting.

Incoming Correspondence: A letter was received from Susan Penner regarding her retirement as Inspector of Independent Schools. She expressed appreciation for the good relationship we have had with her and her office over the years.

Outgoing Correspondence: A letter of appreciation was sent to Susan Penner regarding her retirement as Inspector of Independent Schools.

Matters from the Minutes: High School Finance Committee report on Surplus: A motion "That if the preliminary grant estimates for the 2010 year is realized that the estimated difference of approximately \$75 .00 per student will be used to offset the expected CCES, JC and WO School Society High School payments" was passed by the CCHS Board at their June 17, 2009.

Incoming Correspondence: Thank you cards were received from Mrs J. Deglint and Mrs D. Vanderboom for the flowers given to them by the board.

Outgoing Correspondence: A letter was sent to the office of the Inspector of Independent Schools regarding the re-appointment of H. Moes as Superintendent of Credo Christian Schools for a three-year term. Thank you letters were sent to Corrine VanDelft and Wenda Sikma who completed their terms on the Education Committee.

Principal's report: The Principal's report as received prior to the meeting was discussed. J. Roukema thanked everyone involved in the work that was completed over the summer. New staff members were welcomed to CCES. Ms. Jessica Dokter will be teaching the Grade 3 class, Mrs. Leanne Hofsink, Physical Education for grade 5 & 7 and Mrs. Leslie Scholtens will be teaching the second kindergarten class. The school year theme is from Psalm 9 "I will praise you, O Lord, with all my heart; I will tell of your wonders". The RCDC (Reformed Curriculum Development Committee) K-10 Curriculum Development project has been finished. They still need to make the final copy. There was discussion on whether to have hand sanitizers placed in the school to help combat the spread of the H1N1 flu. Mr. J. Roukema will look into this and discuss it with the Maintenance Committee.

Finance Committee: The minutes of the September 1, 2009 meeting as received prior to the meeting was discussed. The 2008/09 Draft Financial

Statements were e-mailed prior to the meeting and discussed.

Education Committee: The EdCom is reviewing the School Satisfaction Survey and seeing what kind of pro-active things they can bring forward from this survey and to come forward with concrete suggestions.

Maintenance Committee: The minutes of the June 10, 2009 as received prior to the meeting were discussed. Summer Improvement Report: The 'Work Bee' was a success. Thanksgiving and Prayer: Valerie Sikkema closed the meeting with prayer.



Wednesday May 29, 2009
8:00 P.M.

1. Opening: The Chairman M. Stam opened the meeting with singing Hymn 36: 1,4. He read from Psalm 147 and led us in prayer. Everyone was welcomed to the meeting. Quorum was present.
2. Approval of Minutes of the October 29, 2008 meeting: Motion: "to approve the Minutes of the October 29, 2008 meeting as presented" was made, seconded and carried.
3. Business arising from the minutes: None
4. CCES Budget 2009/10: The Treasurer T. Bontkes presented the proposed budget for the 2009/10 year to the membership. Motion: "to approve the 2009/10 budget as presented" was made, seconded and carried.
