## ***From the Chairman....***

*"Unless the Lord builds the house, it's builders labour in vain" - Psalm 127*

It is good to intentionally consider the real source of Credo's continued blessings, as explained by John Calvin in his commentary on Psalm 127: "In affirming that God governs the world and the life of man, Solomon does so for two reasons: First, whatever prosperous events may fall out of men, their ingratitude is instantly manifested by ascribing it wholly to themselves; and thus God is defrauded of the honour which is His due. Solomon, to correct such a perverse error declares that nothing happens prosperously in so far as God blesses our proceedings. Secondly his purpose was to beat down the foolish presumption of men who, setting God aside, are not afraid to undertake anything in exclusive reliance upon their own wisdom and strength." ## ***Short Reports of Board Meetings***

Short Report of the Meeting of the  
Board of Directors of Credo Christian Elementary  
School  
April 10, 2012

- Opening and Welcome: The Chairman, Chris Hoff, opened the meeting and welcomed all Board members, and Principal Heres Snijder.
- Minutes and Short Report: The Minutes and Short Report of the March 13, 2012 Board meeting are adopted.
- Incoming Correspondence: Nothing to report
- Outgoing Correspondence: Letters of appreciation to Mr. A. Nap, Mr. H. Hoogstra, Mr. J. Roukema, Mr. G. Vanopta, Mrs. S. Sikma, and Mrs. H. Vandergugten, for their involvement in the CCES 25th anniversary celebrations.
- Principal's Report: Heres Snijder presented the Principals Report for April 2012 including activities related to staffing for 2012-13, Grade 2/3 blended grade arrangement for 2012-13, and staff professional development.
- Chairman's Report: Chris Hoff provided a verbal report on his activities as Chairman.
- General Business: A number of matters received the attention of the Board including Board-Staff meetings, enrollment requests, vice-principal position, use of electronic media during field trips, and short term collaboration options explored during a joint CCES and WoCS Board meeting held April 10 2012, and approval to enroll a family in September 2012 that attend the Christ Covenant Church in Langley (which is affiliated with the Communion of Reformed Evangelical Churches).
- CCSTA (Transportation): The CCSTA summary report for April 2012 reflects that the CCSTA financial statements are ahead of budget with projected rate reductions for the 2012-13 school year. Further, bus replacement options are being explored to reduce fleet age.
- Education Committee: The minutes of the March 27th meeting are received. Wilfred Bulthuis reported on the activities of the Education Committee including preparations related to the Board/Staff/Parent meeting scheduled for April 19th regarding delivery of Grade 2/3.
- Ad-Hoc Interview Committee: The Ad-Hoc Interview Committee brief regarding staff interviews and recommendations are received for decision. It was agreed to hire Kim Boersema and Natasja VanRhee, and to extend Jennifer Onderwater's duties to include partial teaching in Grade 3.
- Finance Committee: The minutes of the April 2, 2012 are received. Tim Bontkes reported on activities in the Finance Committee including the comparative income statements, receivables, and further considerations related to the draft budget for 2012-13.
- Next Meetings / Events: The next Combined Boards meeting is scheduled for April 23, 2012. The next regular Board meeting is planned for May 8, 2012.
- Closing: Ed Visscher closed with thanksgiving prayer. Chris Hoff adjourned the meeting and thanked all for coming.

## ***Press Release of the CCES and WOCS Joint Board Meeting***

On April 10, 2012, the boards of CCES and WOCS met to discuss the issues and challenges facing each school, and to explore ways in which the schools could work together in mutually beneficial ways. The opportunities and challenges for a number of the different co-operative options were examined. Each of the boards will delegate 2-3 members to a sub-committee tasked to explore some options in more detail, and report back to their respective Boards.

## **Education Committee Report 2012**

We find ourselves again (already!) at the end of another school year. How blessed we are to see our children taught by our dedicated and hard-working staff. Being on the Education Committee gives us the privilege of observing and appreciating our teachers. Along with a Board member, we are visiting each class three times per year, and continue to hear the enthusiasm of teachers and students alike!

Staffing and Enrolment were reviewed, and we say good-bye to Tessa Siebenga and Leslie Scholtens who leave to enjoy a family expansion. We are happy to welcome Kim Boersema, Natasja VanRhee, and Alyson Bosch to our staff next year. The upcoming Grade 2/3 split met with much discussion, particularly with regards to our Pupil-Teacher Ratio Policy, and we pray that all decisions made will prove a positive experience for both teachers and students.

We are thankful to God that Rachel Vanderhorst is recovering from brain surgery, and hopes to be back in the classroom next September! A special thanks to Diane Vanderboom for taking over Rachel's duties, and giving the grade 7 class a happy end to their last elementary year.

As Education Committee, we discussed and approved the preliminary Educational budget. We also looked at the

needs of our growing school with respect to administrative duties re: vice-principalship, as well as the changing duties of our staff within the school. We are thankful for all the teachers who show such a willingness to work out what is best for the children and the school. The use of electronics on field trips was also reviewed and recommended to the Board.

The Education Committee also spent time discussing a book by Tim Challies, titled: *The Next Story: Life and Faith after the Digital Explosion*. We discussed the role of technology in our classrooms, and the dangers it can present to our children. Technology is changing at a rapid pace, and we need to know how to respond and react to the challenges it presents to our children. An Information Technology evening was held on March 28th, where we watched a short video about children and technology, and several rounds of discussion were held. A very informative evening!

We thank our outgoing members, Leona Huttema and Rene Jacobi for their contributions to the Education Committee over the past three years, and look forward to welcoming new members in the 2012/2013 school year.

# Garbage




- Pre-Authorized Debits (PAD) will be adjusted to the new rates as of September 2012.
