## ***ELMACON Math Competition***



On Saturday, May 11, Abigail Hoogstra (gr. 6), Adrian Huttema (gr. 6), and Godfried Doulomay (gr. 5) participated in the Elmacon math competition at UBC. Here are some of their observations:

"I was pretty scared and nervous to start but the man in my room told me that I was competing against myself. During the test the remaining time was written on the board, this made me less nervous" said Abigail.

Adrian said, "My idea of what the contest would be was different than what it was. I liked the contest, it was pretty cool. There were around 300 kids there!"

Godfried said, "The competition was fun but the rooms were cramped. There were too many kids [contestants] in each room."

The competition was set up in three rounds. Abigail, Adrian, Godfried participated in the first two rounds. The first round was called the sprint round and the second round was called the target round. This is what Adrian thought about the first two rounds: "I thought the sprint round was pretty straightforward, I wasn't even that nervous. The target round was fairly easy for me. Everyone had to be on the same page for 15 minutes and there were 3 pages in total. I'm pretty confident that I did well on the test." Godfried and Abigail both found the questions challenging, yet mostly do-able. Godfried said, "The questions at the competition were harder than the ones we got to practice with." The third round was only for the top ten of each grade as its purpose was to find the overall winner. The top 25 of each grade received a certificate but beyond that no one knows where they ranked. This is one thing that our students wish was different; they would all like to know where they ranked.

When Abigail was asked about the overall experience she said: "I would do it again! The leaders were really nice and helpful. I thought they would be strict because the rules on-line seemed so harsh." Adrian and Godfried also said that, if given the opportunity, they would participate in the competition again.

Congratulations to Abigail, Adrian, and Godfried for a great job! You represented your school very well!

## **Getting Ready for Kindergarten!**

Kindergarten is a fun and exciting year for your child. He or she will learn many new things about God and the world He has created, and what it means to be part of a classroom community. As a parent, there are some things you can do to help prepare your child for this year of transition. Keep the following ideas in mind as you assist your child in getting ready for Kindergarten...

**Social Skills:** relating to peers and teachers, created in the image of God

- Model how to share and take turns
- Model how to get attention properly
- Model good manners by using words like "Please" and "thank-you"

**Self-Help Skills:** caring for our bodies, fearfully and wonderfully made by our Creator

- Teaching your child personal hygiene skills (toilet habits and hand-washing)
- Give your child small responsibilities or chores like picking up toys
- Give your child opportunities to make choices
- Model problem solving skills by "thinking out loud"

**Listening Skills:** demonstrating interest in thoughts and ideas of others. Foster a listening/receptive attitude during the presenting and telling of Bible stories.

- Gradually increase the length or number of stories you read to your child
- Ask questions about what you have read...  
"What was the name of the dog...?"  
"What do you think will happen when...?"  
"What would you do if that happened to you...?"
- Recall details of Bible stories heard at home, church and school.
- Model listening skills at the dinner table by taking turns telling each other about the best and worst parts of the day


**Fine-Motor Skills:** growing in independence

- Teach your child how to hold a pencil properly
- Have your child practise taking his or her shoes and boots on and off, do up zippers, and button buttons

**Academic Skills:** growing in knowledge, embedded in a loving, respectful Father-child relationship (Proverbs 1:7),

- Teach your child his/her first and last name
- Help your child learn to write his/her first (and last!?) name, using uppercase for the first letter and lowercase for the remaining letters
- Practise singing and saying the alphabet, identifying individual letters within the alphabet
- Practise counting from 0 to 20 by counting household items such as shoes, socks, plates, cups, or lego pieces.

As you practise and learn, remember that each child is unique and may develop at different rates and levels. Keep the activities you work on with your child part of your daily routine. Make things light, fun, and interesting. With your encouragement, assistance and excitement, your child will be eager and ready for a new year of learning and growing in Kindergarten!

Yearly tuition fees run from September to August. The current fees are payable for July and August for all members -including those with graduating students and those who are relocating.

Fees for the upcoming school-year (2013/14) will be increase from the current year by \$5 per month in the kindergarten tuition category, \$10 per month in the membership & elementary categories and \$15/month in the high school categories according to the schedule below.

We wish to thank our generous hole sponsors and those companies and individuals that donated door prizes. Thank-you to the golfers for signing up to help make this a reality.




