Expansion Plans Over the Summer

The funds generated at the gala are of course dedicated to building expansion that is already well underway. With God's blessing the two room expansion will be completed over the summer, in time for teachers to move in by mid to late August. But we also anticipate much other work over the summer on the playground, renovations to the existing part of the school, new roof ... and more. This again will take more commitment from many volunteers - and we thank you in advance. Please do keep your eye out for notices soliciting help!

As of June 12 2014, we still require approximately \$50,000 of funds to meet our fundraising target of \$284,000. If you have not yet contributed, we encourage you to consider ways in which you could do so yet.

Enrolment Policy

In the last edition of Branches, we noted that the Board is reflecting upon the report submitted by the Enrolment Policy Panel. We thank the panel for their good work, and have agreed to adopt many of the recommendations in their report. In particular, we will return to our former practice of reviewing each application from families that are not eligible to become members on an individual basis. By extension, the moratorium on new families that attend some other churches has also been lifted. However, moving forward we do intend to enhance the application process, including a better structure for visitation of families, and more robust questions regarding the nature and purpose of our school. We would also be pleased to work with other Canadian Reformed Schools in the valley that are interested in coordinating on this approach.

The end of the school year also brings about a flurry of activity as teachers wrap up school trips, perform final tests, prepare report cards, prepare for final assemblies etc. We seek God's blessing upon your weeks, and we hope that staff and students - and membership - will have a refreshing summer, and return back in September reenergized for another year.

The Inductive Method of Bible Study

On Friday June 20, the Lord willing, 23 students will graduate from Credo Christian Elementary School. This is a significant milestone in their lives. Suitable to the occasion, these students will receive the Bible as a parting gift. It is the best gift to give, since it supports 'Credo' in its mission to equip students to use their knowledge, skills and attitudes in God's kingdom.

Recently, the school's supply of graduation gift Bibles ran out. As a result, the Education Committee spent considerable time deciding what 'kind' of Bible would be most suitable as graduation gift. The English Standard Version was selected: no surprise there, as the school follows the church in decisions and directions like this. The Committee also decided to purchase ESV Bibles that feature the Inductive Bible Method. A word of explanation is in place here.

Inductive Bible study consists of three component parts. These three parts are ***observation, interpretation, and application.***

Observation answers the question: What does the passage say? It is the foundation which must be laid in order to accurately interpret and properly apply God's Word. Have you ever read a book, chapter, or verse of the Bible and five minutes later been unable to remember anything you have read? So often we read the Bible with our eyes but not with our mind. There may be several reasons for this. Either

- we think God's Word will magically make an impression on us without any effort on our part, or
- we don't really believe we can understand what we've read, or
- we are waiting for the pastor to teach on this section of Scripture so we'll know what to believe.

Often, however, we forget what we have read simply because we don't know what to look for in the text. So, the question is: what is it that we have to look for when reading the Bible?


Because observation is discovering what the passage is saying, it requires time and practice. The more the Bible is read, the more its truths will become obvious.

Interpretation answers the question: What does the passage mean? The basis for accurate interpretation is always careful observation. Interpretation is the process of discovering what the passage means. As you carefully observe Scripture, the meaning will become apparent.

However, rushing into interpretation without laying the vital foundation of accurate observation may result in outcomes that are determined by personal opinions or feelings, or by what other people have said, rather than what God's Word says.

Interpretation is not necessarily a separate step from observation, for often, as you carefully observe the text, at that very moment you begin to see what it means. Thus, ***interpretation flows out of observation.***

However, interpretation can also involve separate actions or steps that go beyond merely observing the immediate text. One of these exercises is investigating cross-references. First and foremost, ***let Scripture interpret Scripture.*** You may also use other helps, such as word studies or the evaluation of resources such as commentaries and Bible dictionaries to check your conclusions or to supplement your understanding of the historical or cultural setting of the text.



Application answers the question: How does the meaning of this passage apply to me? Usually this is the first thing we want to know when we read the Bible, but proper application actually begins with belief which then results in being and doing. Once the meaning of a passage has become clear, it can be put into practice in obedient response to the Author of Scripture. Ultimately, then, the goal of personal Bible study is a transformed life and a deep and abiding relationship with Jesus Christ.

Application is not a third step in the inductive process. Rather, application takes place when the reader is confronted with truth and decides to respond in obedience to that truth. The basis for application is 2 Timothy 3:16-17:

All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work.

When our students know what God says, what He means, and how to put His truths into practice, they will be equipped for every circumstance of life. To be equipped for every good work of life-totally prepared to handle every situation in a way that honors God-is not only possible, it

is God's will. And that's what they will learn when they are trained to apply these study principles.


When we know what God says, what He means, and how to put His truths into practice, we will be equipped for every circumstance of life.

How Observation, Interpretation, and Application Relate to Each Other

Accurate interpretation and correct application rest on the accuracy of your observations. Therefore, it is vital to develop observation skills, even if at first they seem time-consuming, overwhelming or awkward. Studying inductively is a learning process that does not happen overnight. It happens by doing-doing over and over again, until the doing becomes almost a habit, and a wonderful one at that.

A blessing counted is a blessing retained

This year's Grade 7 students are truly blessed and favored to be able to look forward to five more years of Christ centered and Bible oriented academic training. Faith as well as character development are slow processes that develop only with much patience over time. Neither the one nor the other can be digitized and quickly transferred, as is typical of any maturation process. Students therefore need to become trained students of Scripture who monitor their own growth in faith, personality and character. Growing in wisdom, character and favor with God and man (Luke 2:52) is a long term outcome that can be pursued with confidence and concerted effort, especially through purposeful observation, interpretation and application of Biblical directions. May God richly bless these students in their high school years and cause them to be a blessing in home, church and society.

Short Reports of Board Meetings

Short Report of the Meeting of the Board of Directors of Credo Christian Elementary School May 6, 2014

- **Opening and Welcome:** The Chairman, Chris Hoff, opened the meeting by reading from Psalm 100 and prayer. He welcomed all the Directors and Principal Heres Snijder to the meeting.
- **Agenda Approval:** The agenda for the regular board meeting was approved.
- **Minutes and Short Report:** The Minutes and Short Report of the April 8, 2014 regular Board meeting were adopted.
- **Incoming/Outgoing Correspondence:** Three outgoing letters were approved.
- **Principal's Report:** Heres Snijder presented the Principal's Report for May 2014 and highlighted items related to the recent parent-teacher Boundaries presentation, emergency preparedness, the teacher's handbook, and policy and program development.
- **Chairman's Report:** The Chairman's report for May 2014 was received for information. Chris Hoff reported on his activities as chairman.
- **General Business:** A number of matters were discussed including the recent combined boards meeting, classroom assignments for 2014/15, teacher email accounts, and enrolment policy. The agenda for the upcoming membership meeting was approved.
- **Finance Committee:** The financial statements for April 30, 2014 were submitted and reviewed. The budget for the 2014/15 school year was approved for presentation to the membership.
- **Ad-Hoc Expansion Committee:** Tim Bontkes reported on the activities of the Expansion Committee. The building permit has been received and construction has commenced. Targeted completion is for the end of August. A motion will be made to the membership to allow the securing of bridge financing for the project if required.
- **Maintenance Committee:** Al Leyenhorst reported on the activities of the Maintenance Committee. A request will be put in Branches for community expressions of interest for the janitorial work at the school.
- **Next Meetings / Events:** The May membership meeting is scheduled for May 28, 2014. The next regular Board meeting is planned for June 10, 2014, which will be preceded by a Legal Authority meeting.
- **Closing:** Will VanOene closed with thanksgiving prayer. Chris Hoff adjourned the meeting and thanked all for coming.

From the Education Committee....

With so much build up and excitement buzzing around the school with the expansion underway, it's hard to believe the school year is drawing to a close. Looking back at the work done this year on the Education Committee, we see how God has blessed us with a wonderful school, including a dedicated board, talented staff, and involved parents. Our committee, made up of parents, educators, and fellow Christians, is thankful for the opportunity to meet together each month to discuss the education and discipleship of our children.

The year began with the arrival of two new members to the committee. Jennifer Onderwater and Lisa Van Dyke were welcomed to the table, which was chaired by our board representative, Wilfred Bulthuis. Yolanda very graciously offered to take on the role of secretary, and we thank her for the clear and concise minutes she delivered each month. Thank you also to Heres for providing us with a monthly Principal's Report. It is always encouraging to see how much is going on in the school at any given time; there's no doubt CCES is a happening place!

Agenda items each month vary from smaller housekeeping school issues such as choosing a suitable ESV Bible for the Grade 7 graduation, to more complex discussions on curriculum and school policies. Some matters discussed this year around our table were staffing, classroom sizes, and not surprising to anyone, building expansion plans. Acting as a liaison for Ed Com, Wenda Sikma was appointed to the Expansion Committee, where she was able to give input from an educational perspective. That committee is still hard at work planning the final details of the new classrooms.

Memory work also took up a large section in our binders, as we reviewed other Canadian Reformed schools' and CCES's current memory work curriculum, as well as articles, statistics, and letters written by concerned parents. The discussion of memory work also branched off into the use of the Revised Book of Praise in classroom devotions. A new section with guidelines for classroom devotions was added into the Teacher's Handbook. The Education Committee's

recommendations on memory work and classroom devotions were forwarded to the Board for their discussion.

Boundaries with Kids: How Healthy Choices Grow Healthy Children, written by Drs. Henry Cloud and John Townsend, was the theme of our annual parent information evening. To prepare for the meeting, each member read the book, and presented a chapter to our group. A few chapters were tackled every meeting, and we had good discussions as we reviewed the content. The evening was well received, and Jennifer and Heres ably presented information from the book. A sample of a great quote from *Boundaries with Kids*: One wise father once said, "You have to stick to your guns one more time than the child. If he breaks the rule ten thousand times, you have to stay with it only ten thousand and one times, and you'll win." If you didn't have a chance to attend the evening, the book is a quick read, and gives some interesting food for thought.

Last but not least, each term an Ed Com member is partnered up with a board member to visit the teachers and support staff. We are warmly welcomed by staff and students, and it's always uplifting to see what the students and staff members are busy with. The attention and care our children are given is evidenced in multiple ways, especially when you sit in a classroom and observe. Many different subjects and lessons have been witnessed, from telling time in primary math, to soccer drills in Phys.Ed. Every classroom has its own unique rhythm and routines. Looking around, you see colourful and educational wall displays and students' work proudly displayed; there is joyful singing, capable teaching and assisting, and students hard at work. We thank God for these wonderful blessings, and for our dedicated teachers and educational assistants.

Next year we look forward to taking on new agenda items, both big and small. We say good bye to Yolanda Hoogstra, Jackie Van Oene and Wilfred Bulthuis. Thank you for your contributions over the last three years. We look forward to welcoming two new community members and a new board representative to the Education Committee at our September meeting.

From the CCRTC....


